

GUIDELINES FOR A PHYSIOTHERAPY UK 2021 POSTER

Following last year's feedback we are pleased to be introducing a new, improved poster viewing system (see image below) for this year's virtual Physiotherapy UK conference. In the new platform delegates will be able to

- access the poster system via a link in the virtual world.
- view posters full-screen (improving readability)
- hear a three-minute audio clip of you explaining your poster
- view by theme, author or title in alphabetical order
- download a copy of your poster
- leave comments or email you with questions.

DEADLINE

This year you will be submitting your poster on a **mandatory template** via the new platform, see for more info the section 'Template & design' below. Please submit your poster no later than **Friday 15th October 2021**.

TEMPLATE & DESIGN

You need to download a copy of the **mandatory template** here:

Please click on the tab 'templates' (see yellow arrow in below image) which will download a PowerPoint template, which you can find at the bottom left of your screen (see second yellow arrow in below image). This will be saved into your downloads folder on your computer or device. Alternatively you can open the file and save it in a designated folder.



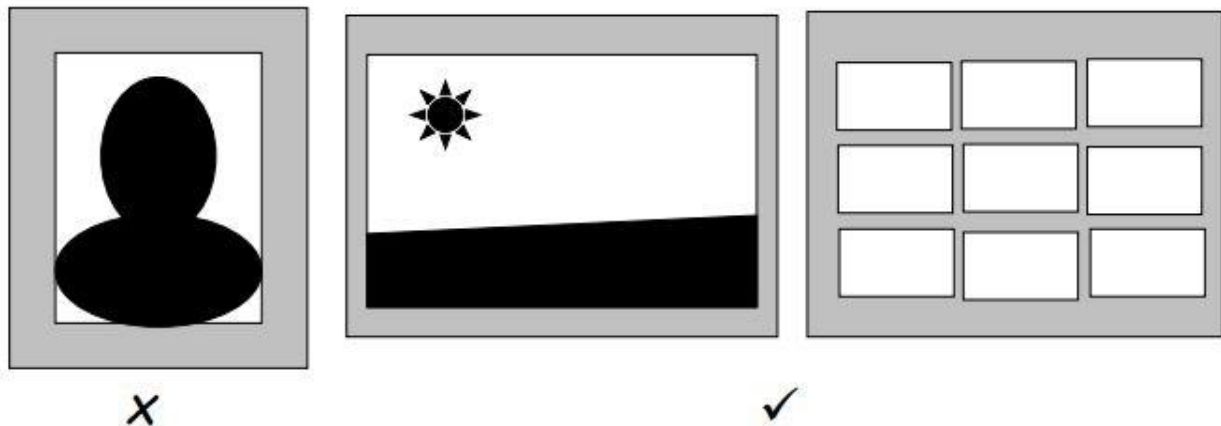
The template has been designed to be consistent for the title area across all posters. You are free to design the rest of the content and layout as you wish.



Please note that the specifications for the posters are:

- Orientation: Landscape
- Software: PowerPoint single slide
- File formats: .ppt, .pptx, .pdf

We cannot deviate from this format due to the system requirements.



1. We suggest that you design your poster layout in the following sections:
 - Purpose
 - Methods
 - Results
 - Conclusions
 - Implications
2. Your poster should also include the following if applicable:
 - References, but try to keep them to a minimum.
 - Acknowledgments to contributors and funding organisations.
 - Ethics approval (if it was required, mentioning the appropriate committee/body that granted it).
 - Provide information about where/how you can be contacted on the poster
3. The poster/presentation is expected to communicate the same information as your submission, although it can be adapted for the presentation style e.g. adding charts/images/tables to posters and summarising key points.
4. All posters must be in English.
5. The use of colour makes the poster more effective and attractive as does breaking up the text with drawings and or photographs.
6. **Ensure** you own the copy-right of any of the images or that the images are copy-right free and allowed to be used for this purpose. **Do not use identifiable people without their consent.** This is against GDPR and you will be the responsible party.

7. Animations and videos cannot be included in your poster.

AUDIO

You can add a three-minute audio clip to explain highlights of your poster on the system. Search for a voice-recorder on your computer or phone. If recording on phone please send and save it to your computer so you will be able to upload it at the same time as uploading your PowerPoint slide.

You will need to save your recording as a *.mp4, *.mp3, *.wav, *.m4a

Please note that audio is not mandatory. If you prefer to not submit an audio-clip, please let us know and we will not follow it up as we will be contacting outstanding audio nearer the time of the conference.

UPLOADING

When you are ready to upload your PowerPoint poster (and audio), please visit https://physiotherapyuk2021.abstractserver.com/eposter_upload/#/home

You will see an upload button, after you press this, you will get to view the below screen. Here you can upload your files. Once done, please press the button 'next' which will bring you to the consent page. Toggle the button (bottom left) to green to agree and press 'next' (bottom right)

The abstracts will be published in an Elsevier supplement and where applicable, the Innovations database, as originally submitted.

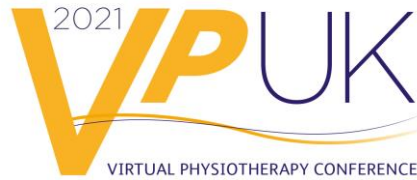
